

## **TRAIL OPENING AND CLOSING**

The ATV/UTV trails in Langlade County open following closing of the snowmobile trails in the spring as early as possible when ATV/UTV trail conditions allow. Trails must close no later than December 1st of each year. Opening and closing is organized following inspections of the trail system by the Department and cooperating ATV/UTV trail clubs. Trail opening and closures are dependent upon trail conditions which provide for safety of the riders, protection of trail surfaces and protection of the forest and lands.

**Approved road routes in Langlade provide year-round use for ATV/UTV riders to enjoy.**

Official opening and closing of ATV/UTV trails are completed by a public service announcement by the Langlade County Forestry, Parks and Recreation Department. Trail opening and closing announcements may be found at [langladecounty.org](http://langladecounty.org).

In addition, 270 miles of open unpaved road routes and 716 miles of open paved road routes provide connectivity and riding opportunities.

These trails and routes take you through the diverse landscapes of Langlade County and access the many communities and businesses that support our motorized recreational opportunities.

The four main trails systems are the Parrish Highlands Trail, Augustyn Springs Trail, Pickerel/Pearson ATV Trail, and White Lake ATV Trail. The main trails are connected through various road routes to provide a Countywide network.

**PARRISH HIGHLAND ATV/UTV TRAIL**

Located In northwest Langlade County, 50 miles long, entirely on County Forest Property within portions of the Parrish Highlands and Moccasin Recreation Areas. Connecting trails with Oneida and Lincoln County trail systems.

**AUGUSTYN SPRINGS ATV/UTV TRAIL**

Located in central Langlade County, 21 miles long, entirely on County Forest Property within portions of the Jack Lake and Kettlebowl Recreation Areas.

**PICKEREL/PEARSON ATV/UTV TRAIL**

Located in northeastern Langlade County, 5 miles long, entirely on County Forest Property within portions of the Charles de Langlade Recreation Area. This trail provides a primary connection between the Parrish Highland ATV/UTV Trail, Augustyn Springs ATV/UTV Trail, the Forest County ATV/UTV trail system and State trails in Forest County connecting to the rest of the state.

**WHITE LAKE ATV/UTV TRAIL**

Located in southeastern Langlade County, 20 miles long, mostly on County Forest Property within portions of the Crocker Hills Recreation Areas and including some trail portions on the Wolf River State Trail and private forest lands. Trails and routes also provide a primary connection to the Oconto County ATV/UTV trail system and State trails in Oconto County connecting to the rest of the state.
