Sec. 28-33. - Authority.

This article is enacted pursuant to authority granted the village by Wis. Stats. § 61.34 as authorized by Wis. Stats. § 23.33(8)(b) and Wis. Stats. ch. 350.

Sec. 28-34. - Designated access routes.

- (a) The village has designated routes for access to travel to and from the all-terrain vehicle and snowmobile trail within the entire village limits. The designated access routes are to be used for direct access only to the Wisconsin State Trail/Old Rail Road Grade for all-terrain vehicles and snowmobiles. Upon posting, the routes may be changed or closed within the village limits by order of the village board when deemed necessary.
- (b) The designated access routes to the main trail for all-terrain vehicles and snowmobiles within village limits are:
- (1) Robbins Street.
  - (2) Motion Street.
  - (3) Mill Street east of Birch Street.
  - (4) Birch Street.
  - (5) Anderegg Street.
  - (6) Marked portion of Wood Street east of Bissell Street.
  - (7) Marked portion of Bissell Street north of Wood Street.
  - (8) Marked portion of Gamble Street east of South Shore Street.
  - (9) South Shore Street.
  - (10) Lakeside Street.
  - (11) Church Street.
  - (12) Mytas Road to village limits.
  - (13) Fire Street (an alley).
  - (14) Legion Street (an alley).
  - (15) Marked alley between Anderegg Street and Lake Street.
  - (16) Marked portion of Marathon Drive from Lakeside St. to N. Lake Lane.
- (c) A map of the route for the all-terrain vehicle and snowmobile access routes in the village is available in the office of the village clerk.

Sec. 28-35. - Conditions.

As a condition for the use of the designated access routes, the following restrictions shall apply to all operators of all-terrain vehicles and snowmobiles, and to passengers, where applicable:

- (1) Headlights must be on at all times.
- (2) Routes must be signed in accordance with Wis. Admin. Code §§ NR 64.12 and 64.12(7)(c) for all-terrain vehicles and Wis. Stats. ch. 350 for snowmobiles.
- (3) Vehicles shall proceed in single file.
- (4) Vehicles must travel on the blacktop portion of the extreme right of the streets.
- (5) A maximum speed limit of ten miles per hour must be observed within the village limits.
- (6) Any person born on or after January 1, 1988, is required to have a safety certificate issued by the state department of natural resources.
- (7) All persons under the age of 18 operating or riding such vehicles must wear a helmet.
- (8) Vehicles must display current registration decals or valid registration renewal receipts.
- (9) Access trails shall automatically close when the county trail is closed or upon posting by the village board.
